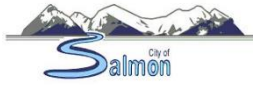

# 2016 Programs at the Outdoor School

## **CLASSES: (\$6 each unless otherwise noted)**

**June 10<sup>th</sup>–10am Loom Beading**—Learn how to set up a bead loom, design a pattern, and create a beautiful piece of art.

**June 17<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Flint Knapping**—Make stone tools including arrow points, Atl Atl dart points, knives scrapers, burins, and more, using obsidian or other lithic materials.

**June 18<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Father's Day Shoot & Historic Firearms Display— \$6/person, \$10/family.** Bring your Dad to Outdoor School and have a blast trying your hand at bows and arrows, Atl Atl target practice, hatchet throwing and more!

**June 24<sup>th</sup>–10am Making Fur Trapper Hats**  
First make a pattern and then sew a hat using the blanket stitch. Note: Extra cost for supplies, paid the day of the class

**June 30<sup>th</sup>–10am & 1pm Dragonfly Carving**  
Hone your wood carving skills and make a small dragonfly from a piece of willow

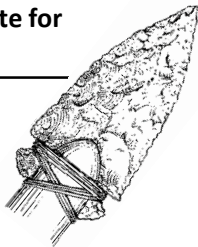
**July 8<sup>th</sup>–10am Knife Making**—with stacked handle hafting— make a knife using leather, bone and wood.

**July 15<sup>th</sup>–10am & 1pm Knife Sheaths**— Make a rugged leather Rocky Mountain style sheath for your favorite knife.

**July 29<sup>th</sup>–10am Whole Willow Shoot Baskets**  
Ages 12 and up. Using English Basketry and Native Willows we will learn the basics of whole shoot baskets!

**August 5<sup>th</sup>–10am & 1pm Finger Weaving**  
Learn a technique used by tribes across the country to make beautiful patterned straps and belts

**August 11-21<sup>th</sup>–1805 Living Experience** A living history event in which participants strive to emulate and re-create life as it might have been for Lewis and Clark when they passed through the Lemhi Valley in August 1805. Join us in hide tanning, basketry & fire making, shelter building, primitive cooking methods, processing wild foods and more! Visitors are welcome to observe! (**\$ see website for costs**)



Please pre-register! If space is available you are welcome to take your chances and register onsite the morning of the program but some classes fill up quickly.

**June 23<sup>rd</sup> & June 25<sup>th</sup>–8pm Frontier Trade Circle**— Free and open to all ages for public participation. Bring your own items to trade!! Frontier trappers and Native Americans would meet and buy and trade items each season.

**June 24<sup>th</sup>–7:30pm Native American Tipi** presentation— participants will put up a model tipi

**July 1<sup>st</sup>–1–4pm Buckskin Clothing**—Display and demonstration of 1800s clothing made from buckskin and furs

**July 2<sup>nd</sup>–10am–4pm Visit the Village & Clothing of the Lewis and Clark Expedition**

**July 7<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Building a survival shelter**—Watch as a brush shelter used by early people is framed.

**July 9<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Visit the Village**

**July 14<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Making Cattail Mats**—Watch as the strong inner stem of the cattail is used to make mats that had many uses for Sacajawea's people.

**July 28<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Tools for Tanning**—Watch as tanning tools used by early people are used to make soft leather clothing.

**August 4<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Making Cattail Mats**—Watch as the strong inner stem of the cattail is used to make mats that had many uses for Sacajawea's people.

**August 6<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Visit the Village & People of the Lewis and Clark Expedition**

**August 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>—Agai'dika Heritage Days**

Commemorating Sacajawea's return to her homeland with the Lewis & Clark Expedition in August 1805: Native American dancing, heritage skills and craft demonstrations, interpretive talks, the 1805 Living Experience, and more! (Volunteers needed!)

**August 25<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, & 27<sup>th</sup>–10am–4pm Visit the Village**

**September 3<sup>rd</sup>–10am–4pm Visit the Village**

The Outdoor School provides hands-on ancestral living experiences and education. Programs begin at 10:00 a.m. Program lengths are about 2 hrs. Most programs are designed generally for ages 8 to adult. Younger children can attend with adult supervision.

**Scholarships:** Through generous donations from local service organizations and individuals we are able to offer full and partial scholarships to students who complete an application. Applications will be available at sign-ups and later at City Hall, the Sacajawea Center, and electronically at [www.sacajawecenter.org](http://www.sacajawecenter.org).

### **NOTE:**

- All classes are filled on a first-registered, first-served basis.
- Full payment is required at the time of registration.
- Complete one registration form for each individual registering for a class/classes.
  - You can mail your registration form to: Sacajawea Center/City of Salmon; 200 Main Street; Salmon, ID 83467
  - Or deliver it to City Hall at 200 Main Street. Office hours are 8:00am- 4:45pm, Mon.–Fri. unless closed for holiday.
  - Payment may be made by check or money order payable to *City of Salmon*, or by MasterCard or Visa.
  - For credit card transactions up to \$60.00 add a \$1.95 transaction fee; over \$65.00 a 3% convenience fee will be charged.

### **Registration Confirmation:**

An email will be sent confirming the classes, dates, and times that you/your child signed up for. A class reminder will not be sent. Our staff will attempt to reach students via email and/or telephone if a class is full or canceled.

**Please keep a copy of your submitted registration form and schedule your class(es) on your calendar!**

### **Refunds & Insufficient Funds Charges:**

- A refund of class tuition will be given only if the class is full or is cancelled by the Sacajawea Center.
- Payment for one class can be transferred to another as long as there is still space available.
- A non-sufficient fund (NSF) check will be charged a \$25.00 service fee.
  - If a NSF check is received or a credit or debit card is declined, a student may not participate in a class until both the NSF charge and the registration fees are paid by cash or money order to the City of Salmon staff.
