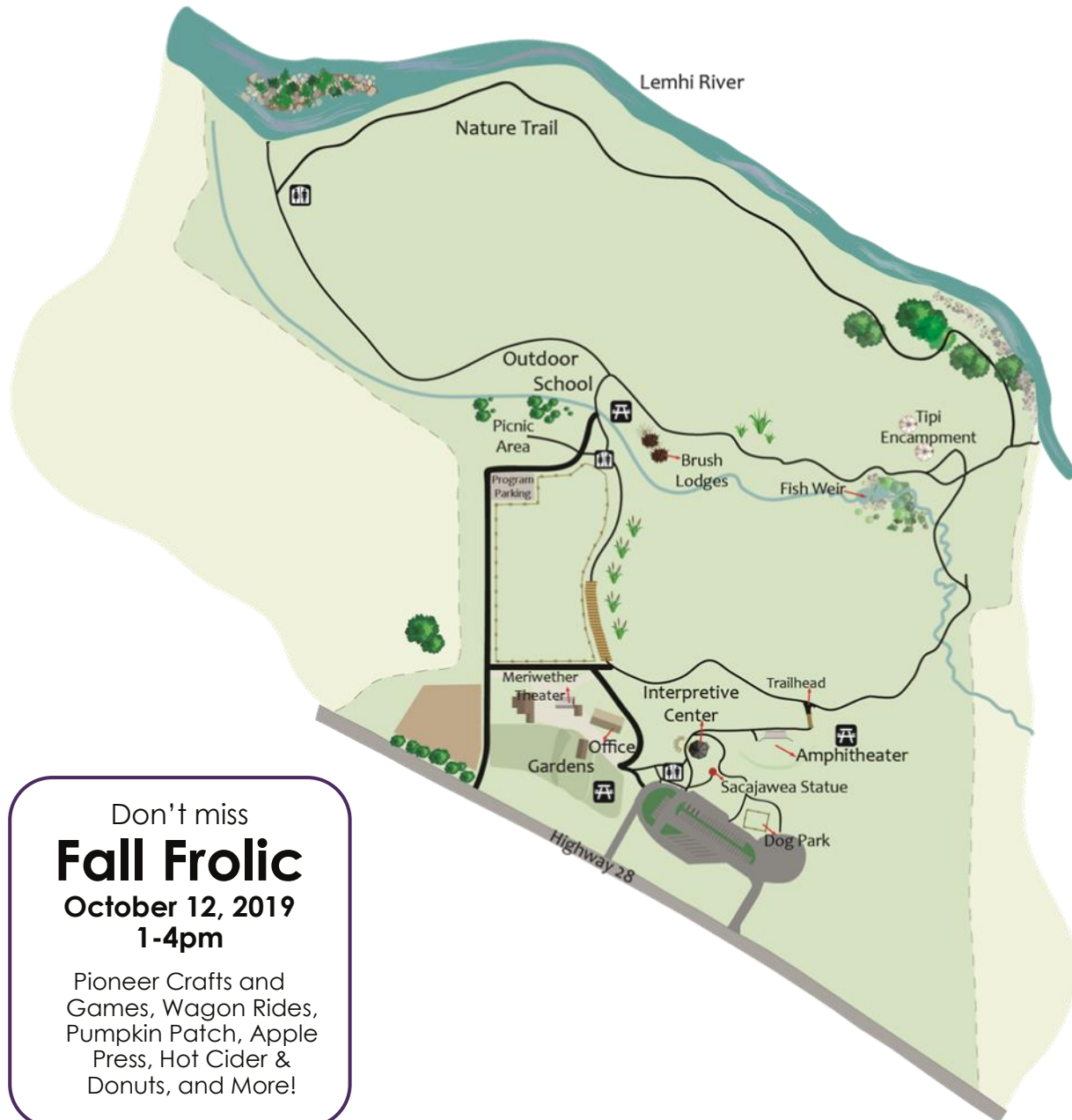

About the Outdoor School

The Salmon Outdoor School provides hands-on ancestral living experiences that bring history alive. Registration is required and first come, first serve. Each class begins at 10:00 am at the Outdoor School unless otherwise noted. Check to see if your class is "drop-in" any time throughout the day or not. Programs typically last about 2 hrs. Most projects will not be completed in this time and students are welcome to spend more time onsite to finish their projects. Outdoor School programs are designed for people ages 8 to adult. Younger children may attend a program if accompanied and supervised by an adult. Program with a (\$) indicate a \$6 fee unless otherwise noted. We happily accept donations for all other programs. If space is available you are welcome to register onsite the morning of the program but we strongly advise pre-registration.

Drop-in Class—Working with leather is not as hard as you might think! Join us to learn leather tooling methods to decorate a belt. *Ages 10 and up.*

With local clay you will learn the coiling and pinch pot method used to make simple vessels. The class includes how to look for materials, clay preparation and tempering, a discussion of methods for outdoor firing and fire pit construction.

Drop in anytime to watch our 1800s ancestral village in live action! As a participant you will live and learn the crafts and skills employed by the Lewis and Clark Expedition including hide tanning, outdoor cooking, foraging, and shelter building! (\$\$) Pre-registration is required. If you would like to participate in this overnight program please give us a call! You do not have to attend the entire program to participate.
- 17th** **Shoshone-Bannock Agaidika Gathering**
You are invited to join the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes as they honor their homeland and ancestors with a spiritual walk/run along Agency Creek in the morning. The walk/run will be followed later in the day by singing, drumming and dancing, and a salmon and buffalo feast onsite.
