2017 Programs at the Outdoor School

CLASSES: (\$6 each unless otherwise noted)

June 2nd–10am Archaeological Dig—Become an archeologist for a day by excavating, record keeping, and identifying your findings!

June 9th–10am Flint & Steel Fires—Learn to make fire without matches, just like Lewis and Clark did! Flint and steel were the main fire making tools of the Expedition and we'll show you the ropes! Ages 8 & up.

June 17th–10am–4pm Father's Day Shoot—Bring your Dad to Outdoor School and have a blast trying your hand at shooting a bow and arrows, throwing the Atlatl, working on your hatchet target practice and more! Stop by anytime between 10am and 4pm. Stay as long as you want! Cannon firing demos, historic gun display and "man stuff" from the 1800s. *Admissions: \$2 per person*

June 23rd–10am Patterns in Plants—Learn how to identify 4 major families of plants. Try some of the edible plants that were a hit on the menu of early pioneers and the Lewis & Clark Expedition. Ages 6 & up.

July 1st–10am Animal Tracking (\$10)—This class will teach you the basics of animal tracking and observation. Take home a plaster cast of your favorite animal track!

July 7th–10am Native American Story Telling & Sign Language—Learn how people have used signs and pictures to communicate thoughts and ideas throughout history. Ages 6 and up.

July 14th–10am Gifts of the Deer—Participants will explore the many things early people made from the deer they hunted and go home with their very own buckskin bag.

July 21st–10am Tools from Stones & Bones—Before modern technology all our ancestors used stones and bones to make tools to help in their everyday life. Learn the ancient art of flint knapping and make your own arrowhead or stone knife!

August 4th–10am Making Cattail Mats—The cattail was an important commodity to Sacajawea's people. Learn how to prepare cattail for weaving and make your own cattail basket!

August 10th–20th–1805 Living Experience—A living history event in which participants strive to emulate and re-create life as it might have been for Lewis & Clark when they passed through the Lemhi Valley in August 1805. Join us in hide tanning, basketry & fire making, shelter building, primitive cooking methods, processing wild foods and more! Visitors are welcome to observe!! August 25th–10am Making Cordage—Early people made sturdy cordage and rope from plant fibers such cattail and nettles. Learn how to find and process plants for cordage and make a knotted necklace!

NOTE: The Outdoor School provides hands-on ancestral living education and experience for all ages. Programs begin at 10:00am. Program lengths are about 2 hours. Most programs are designed for ages 8 to adult. **Younger children can attend with adult supervision.** Please pre-register! If space is available you are welcome to take your chances and register onsite the morning of the program, but some classes fill up quickly.

Scholarships: Through generous donations from local service organizations and individuals we are able to offer full and partial scholarships to students who complete an application. Applications will be available at sign-ups and later at City Hall, the Sacajawea Center, and electronically at www.sacajaweacenter.org.

- All classes are filled on a first-registered, first-served basis.
- Full payment is required at the time of registration.
- Complete one registration form for each individual registering for a class/classes.

 - Or deliver it to City Hall at 200 Main Street. Office hours are 8:00am- 4:45pm, Mon.–Fri. unless closed for holiday.
 - Payment may be made by check or money order payable to *City of Salmon*, or by MasterCard or Visa.
 - For credit card transactions up to \$60.00 add a \$1.95 transaction fee; over \$65.00 a 3% convenience fee will be charged.

Registration Confirmation:

An email will be sent confirming the classes, dates, and times that you/your child signed up for. A class reminder will not be sent. Our staff will attempt to reach students via email and/or telephone if a class is full or canceled.

Please keep a copy of your submitted registration form and schedule your class(es) on your calendar!

Refunds & Insufficient Funds Charges:

- A refund of class tuition will be given only if the class is full or is cancelled by the Sacajawea Center.
- Payment for one class can be transferred to another as long as there is still space available.
- A non-sufficient fund (NSF) check will be charged a \$25.00 service fee.
 - If a NSF check is received or a credit or debit card is declined, a student may not participate in a class until both the NSF charge and the registration fees are paid by cash or money order to the City of Salmon staff.
