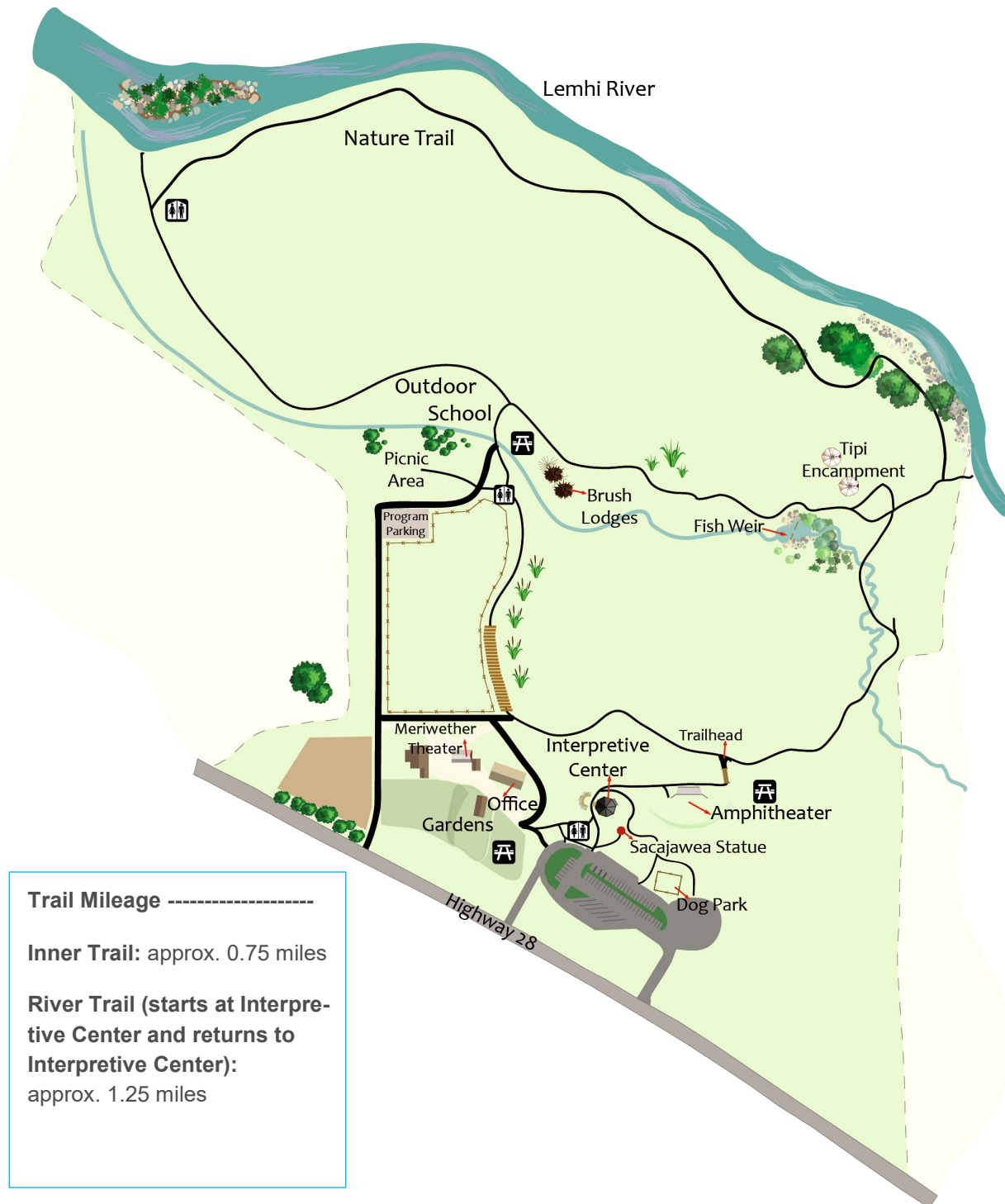
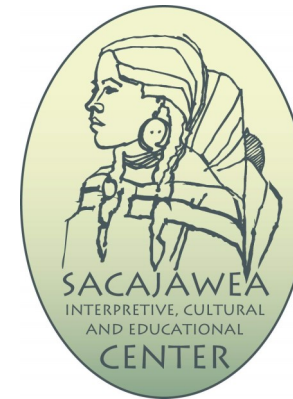


## Sacajawea Center Site Map
